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

ITIN Eligibility

What is an ITIN?

- Required if you are obligated to file U.S. income tax returns and are <u>not</u> eligible for an SSN
- Needed to dispense certain student scholarships, fellowships, grants, and/or stipends
- Does not establish identity or serve as work authorization

Do I Need an ITIN?



Application Process

Step 1: GLACIER Account

▶ Request a UC Santa Cruz GLACIER account from your funding source, usually your department.

♦ Complete online GLACIER record using information from your immigration documents.

Step 2: IRS Forms

- **♦** Complete Form W-7. (See following slides.)
- ♦ Complete Form W-8BEN if applicable. (See following slides.)
- Bring your *original* immigration documents to an ISSS Advisor to get an ITIN certification letter. (See following slides.)
- Make copies of your immigration documents.
- Print all forms and documents single-sided!

ITIN Certification Letter

- ♦ Applies to F-1 and J-1 students only
- Can only be written by ISSS advisor
- Verifies that you are submitting true photocopies of the following original documents:
 - Passport biographical page
 - Visa
 - I-20/DS-2019
 - Electronic I-94 printout
- With letter, you:
 - Can submit *copies* of identification documents, i.e. passport, instead of submitting the original.
 - Do not need to also submit income tax return.

Step 3: Assemble Application

- Original, signed ITIN certification letter from ISSS advisor
- Completed original, signed W-7 form
- ♦ Completed original, signed W-8BEN form (if claiming tax treaty benefits)
- Printed photocopies of:
 - Passport biographical page
 - Visa stamp (*Canadians exempt)
 - ♦ I-20/DS-2019
 - Electronic I-94 printout

Step 4: Mail Application

Mail complete ITIN application to:

♦ Decision typically within take 6-8 weeks.

Step 5: Once Approved for ITIN

• Once approved, IRS will send you a letter with your ITIN
